A Home for "Klayton's Krew"

The Butcher Family first stayed at the Nashville Ronald McDonald House six years ago. In early December 2016, young parents Kody and Lori Butcher of Pulaski, TN received devastating news about their nine-month-old son, Klayton. Klay was diagnosed with a grade 2 Ependymoma brain tumor located on

his brain stem that was spreading to his spine. They were immediately rushed to Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt to remove his tumor, however. cancer cells still remained in his body.

Living 75 miles away from the hospital, the Butcher Family checked home after their 44-night stay in summer 2023. into the Nashville Ronald McDonald House in May of 2017 for Klav to begin daily radiation. During their first stay,

they spent a total of 49 nights. While Klay fought against a brain tumor, he continued to achieve childhood milestones. From meeting new friends to learning how to walk, the Nashville House became their "home-away-from-home".

In 2023, the Butcher Family again received devastating news after an MRI. Klay was diagnosed with another brain

tumor. Returning to Nashville for treatment a second time, the Butcher Family staved at the Nashville Ronald McDonald House, along with a new little sister, Emmi. Their journey back to the House brought the Butcher

Family comfort, knowing they would be taken care of while Klay underwent surgery to remove the tumor as well as 30 days of radiation.

During their most recent 44-night stay, Klav and the rest of the Butcher family celebrated milestones with the staff and families staying at the Nashville Ronald House. Klay celebrated his seventh birthday, along with sister Emmi's fourth; they enjoyed a night out at a Vanderbilt Baseball game; Klay and Emmi played games with the House staff; they even enjoyed meeting Metro Police Dept. officers and testing out the sirens in the police vehicles; and every morning, Klay enjoyed feeding the fish! To celebrate the end of his radiation, Klay and his

family were able to enjoy a VIP experience at the NASCAR Xfinity race at the Nashville Superspeedway.

"Klayton's Krew" was written on NASCAR Driver Ryan Ellis' car to highlight Klay and his loyal supporters!

Klay is now enjoying his summer fishing and getting ready for first grade. As he continues to go back and forth to the hospital for checkups, the Nashville House will remain a "home-awayfrom-home" for the Butcher
